DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR CHURCH, INTERRUPTED

EPISODE 1 LET'S TALK ABOUT CHURCH IN THE NEW NORMAL

We encourage you to form a community. Take a few moments after you've watched the first episode to share your reflections with each other based on the questions below. Remember to flavour your responses with kindness and respect!

- 1) Introduce yourself by sharing your name and the parish you are from.
- 2) Share some of the ways you have remained connected with the church in this season.
- 3) In the 2005 encyclical Deus Caritas Est ("God is Love"), Pope Benedict XVI speaks of the threefold duty of the church, namely to preach the gospel, to celebrate the sacraments, and to serve the needy. How can we as the laity in this season carry out these responsibilities where we are.

EPISODE 2 - MISSIONARY NATURE OF THE CHURCH

- 3) At the end of this episode, Fr. Terence shares the story of a lighthouse. In your experience, are our parishes more like a clubhouse (focused on insiders) or a lighthouse (focused on reaching those outside)?

- 1. Describe your most meaningful experience participating in Christ's mission.
- 2. In what ways did you identify with the discussion on ordained/lay relationship in this week's session?
- 3. Pope Francis in the 2013 encyclical Evangeli Guadium ("Joy of the Gospel") stressed that "the new evangelisation calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptised." (#120) How can our parish communities better express the belief that everyone is responsible to carry out the mission of Christ?





EPISODE 4 WHAT'S GOOD ABOUT THE GOOD NEWS?

- 3. On a scale of 1-10, how prepared do you feel to share the gospel? Explain.

- b) Imagine you were in the middle of a conversation with a friend. How might you weave in the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus in a way that feels natural and not awkward?

EPISODE 6 BECOMING A SERVANT CHURCH
